2. AGRICULTURE

Agriculture accounts for 5 % of the GDP and the country is largely selfsufficient. Traditionally, the Spanish agriculture has had low productivity, and although technological advances and irrigation has resulted in considerable gains, the country still lags behind the most efficient European countries. The relatively inefficient livestock sector suffers from European imports but Spanish fruit and vegetable producers are benefiting from their access to the EC markets.
