Social Assistance

(a) Long Term Assistance

Available to:

adults or families with mental or physical incapacities,

widowed mothers with dependent children,

other women with children and without adequate means,

unmarried mothers caring for their children,

fathers with dependent children if they are incapacitated or must remain at home because the mother is

incapacitated, deceased, in jail, in a sanatorium, in a hospital, has deserted the home.

Definition of Income

Non-Allowable Income includes:

Canada Pension Plan Payments, Old Age Security, Old Age Assistance,

Blind Persons Allowance, Disabled Persons Allowance,

Veterans Allowances,

Workmen's Compensation

Unemployment Insurance,

pensions from other sources,

\$25 per month for each person living with applicant and receiving any of the above benefits.

\$25 per month for employed adult relatives living with applicant except where earnings are less than social assistance rates for food, clothing and medical care.

Allowable Income includes:

casual earnings, salaries and wages, gross board and lodging receipts, gross room rentals in applicant's residence.

gross rentals of property not part of recipient's residence,
