I should like to mention one other point, Mr. Speaker, in connection with aid to students other than by loans or scholarships. The hon, member for Edmonton West seemed to suggest that there is something all right about the element of struggle, that if you had to work hard in order to get through university—and perhaps the Minister of Finance had to work his way through university—so did a lot of other people too. I remember that when I went to university I had to spend three days a week working in a warehouse and I spent three days a week attending university, and I can testify that is is not the best system. I had to miss out on sports as well as on intellectual activities.

I think that the element of struggle is rather old-fashioned now. I think we should make it easier for people to go to university and be able to obtain the benefits of university life. I do not mind students working during the summertime but I think that while at university their attention should be centred on the activities in the classroom and outside the classroom.

Last week the Minister of Finance in his introductory remarks said that the student loans fund was one stage in the government plan for students, presumably he meant that the scholarships would have to come later. This afternoon the Minister without Portfolio made reference to the same thing. It is an interim step, and he said rather vaguely that he hoped we would be able to achieve tuition free universities in Canada. But how long will this take? The government has now been in office for three years. We have got no farther than the student loan plan. When is the next step going to take place? By next year the first group of students, those who entered university in 1963 when the government took office, will graduate. How many graduations will there be before we get beyond the student loan fund?

Mr. Maurice Allard (Sherbrooke): Mr. Speaker, the bill now before us is another instance of the constitutional hodge-podge in which we have been plunged by the present government and it is another indication of the continued mix-up in federal-provincial relations. This bill concerns student loans.
