MOTION TO ADJOURN UNDER S.O. 26

WATER RESOURCES

NEWFOUNDLAND—POLLUTION OF PLACENTIA BAY—NATIONAL PARK—BELL ISLAND EMPLOYMENT—AIRPORT FACILITIES—MOTION FOR ADJOURNMENT UNDER STANDING ORDER 26

Mr. Walter C. Carter (St. John's West): Mr. Speaker, I request leave under Standing Order 26 to move that this house do now adjourn to discuss a specific and important matter requiring urgent consideration, namely the critical economic plight of the people of Newfoundland due to the failure of the responsible ministers to plan and implement remedies for the grievances caused by the phosphorous pollution of Placentia Bay and St. Mary's Bay, with the consequent loss of livelihood of the fishermen of that area as a result of the failure of the federal government to ensure that necessary precautions were taken before the plant commenced operations.

I move this motion in view of the failure of the government to enter into an agreement with Newfoundland for the establishment and development of a national park on Newfoundland's west coast which would substantially reduce the economic disparity of the region, the failure of the government to come to grips with the serious unemployment and social problems on Bell Island since the closing of the mine in 1966, the failure of the federal government to develop essential international airport facilities at Gander, thereby depriving the people of the east coast of Newfoundland from sharing in the advantages accruing from a modern international airport.

Mr. Speaker: The hon. member for St. John's West has proposed that the business of the house be set aside for the purpose of discussing a number of problems in the province of Newfoundland. Actually my interpretation of this motion is that it is in the form of a series of grievances.
