Forest industry consultative task force report, disagreement rather than question of, 2836  
Forestry Service, disagreement rather than question of, 1464-5  
Loto Canada purchases, disagreement rather than question of, 1800  
Petro-Canada, government financial responsibility, M. to refer to Privileges and Elections Committee, no deliberate attempt to mislead, not question of, 1159  
Television manufacturing industry, disagreement rather than question of, 3261

Minister stating study not endorsed by ECC and outdated statistics quoted, disagreement rather than question of, 3018

Ministerial statements outside House, not question of, 2792-3

Ministers' and prime minister's answers in House contradicting testimony before McDonald inquiry commission, 407

Ministers' and prime minister's answers misleading House *re* purchase of fighter aircraft, M. to refer to Privileges and Elections Committee, 3224, ministers denial accepted, 3259-60, proceed with question when both members in House, 3352, minister's denial accepted, not a question of, 3462

Minister's letter deceiving member *re* RCMP mail openings, obstructing member in performance of duties, M. to refer to Privileges and Elections Committee, Chair to determine acceptability, 781-3, 786-7, 790-2, 924, complaint was raised at first opportunity, precedents state that contempt committed in 1 Parliament may be punished in another, letter considered a proceeding of House since it affected members conduct in House, *sub judice* convention not applicable since McDonald inquiry commission not court, 964-7, form of motion altered to conform with precedents, question of parallel inquiries and doctrine of ministerial responsibility have no procedural basis, *prima facie* case of contempt against House, M. accepted, 1856-7, 1867

Minister's letter misleading *re* RCMP Corporal Radey secret trial, M. to refer to Privileges and Elections Committee, minister's denial that letter was misleading accepted, disagreement rather than question of, 874

Ministers misinterpreting statutes *re* Petro-Canada's borrowing abilities, affecting member's ability to function, M. to refer to committee, disagreement on law and facts rather than question of, 1106-7

Minister's remarks *re* member misleading House, incorrect statistics used in questions, disagreement, not question of, 3946

Ministers' remarks *re* protecting income tax returns, disagreement, not question of, 3683

Ministers statement incorrect *re* contaminated feed, not question of, no notice given, minister allowed to comment, 3482-3

Motion accepted, debate interrupted by adjournment hour and placed on order paper under "Motions", 1877, 1891

Motions under S.O. 43, allowing member to move, matters concerning procedure of House not acceptable under provisions of S.O. 43, not question of, 2516

Motions under S.O.43, member not allowed to read, matter of partisan nature and urgency requirement lacking, not question of, 4236-8

National unity task force report, copies available to members, grievance rather than question of, 2756-7

Newspaper article erroneous *re* timing of Auditor General's report, grievance rather than question of, 1015, 1322

Notice required for offences occurring in previous sittings, 958, 961, 1012-5

## Oral questions

Argumentative or political, reviewing guidelines, M. to refer to Privileges and Elections Committee, Chair does not rule on political grounds, Chair exercises own discretion on acceptability of argumentative questions, not question of, 1799

Ministerial responsibility, acting minister answering after question period, Chair stating minister not serving in acting capacity, not allowed to answer after question period, not question of, 2121

## Opportunity to ask

Hypothetical, not question of, 3764-5

Matter solely within discretion of Chair, not question of, 2120

Refused on basis subject already dealt with, Chair misunderstood nature of question, will allow member to put question at first opportunity, 4410-1

Poultry marketing board, establishing, extension of question period rather than question of, 2121

Press inaccurately reporting proceedings of House, difference of opinion not to be dealt with by House, factual inaccuracies have already been thoroughly dealt with by Chair, not question of, 1959

Press inaccurately reporting proceedings of House *re* unanimous approval of motion on seal hunt, members not identified, no individual wronged, not question of, 4042

Prime minister answer evasive *re* return of Cossette-Trudels, 1705, disagreement rather than question of, 1743-4

Social insurance numbers, use extended for Canada savings bonds, 731, not a question of, 793

Question period, *see above* Ministers, Attendance—Points of order Questions on notice

Answers, no procedural basis for Chair to compel, 4378

Answers, recourse when inadequate, 1325

Calling after throne speech debate, 171, 314

Delay in answering, 4152

Grievance, rather than point of, 3999

No reply, grievance noted, 3543

Refusal to answer, parliamentary secretary complaining about costs involved, no refusal to answer, not question of, 3485

Ruling, reflection on, 330, 1012-3, 4245

Supply motions, member speaking in reply not allowed 30 minutes if not government member, 1059

Television in House, under direction of Chair, 3944

## Ways and means motions

Amdt. similar to motion previously moved in same session, 1240, 1245, not in order, member allowed to substitute amended proposition with unanimous consent, 1248-9

Not debatable, 4285

Subamdt. beyond scope of main motion and replaces part of amdt., not in order, NDP member reserved right to move another by unanimous consent, 1250-1, member may not speak to subamdt., 1282
