In the Faculty of Arts, and also in the 3rd. and 4th. Years of the Faculty of Applied Science, provision is made by offering alternate courses for students who desire to take Military instruction. On the other hand in the first two years of the course in the Faculty of Applied Science the curriculum is very crowded and it has been found necessary to make it rigid and uniform for students in all departments of Engineering. There are no alternatives offered, and if students in these first two years of thise Faculty desire to obtain Military Education they must take it as an extra subject. Mount Allison and Acadia Universities are affiliated with McGill University so far as the first two years in this Faculty are concerned. Their course is, consequently, identical with ours, and there is no opportunity for offering alternatives in either. I remain. Yours very sincerely, Frank D. adams
