PREFACE.

THE following selections from the Lectures of the late Dr. Punshon are printed in the same order as that in which the Lectures were first published, so far as that order is known. Two of them, "The Men of the Mayflower," and "Science, Literature, and Religion," are now printed for the first time. It may be well to remind the reader that the lecture on "Science, Literature, and Religion" was prepared more than thirty years ago, while Dr. Punshon was still a Probationer for the Ministry.
