EXAMINATIONS OF MASTERS AND MATES.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY FOR A FOREIGN-GOING SHIP.

EXAMINATION IN COLORS—All candidates for certificates of competency must pass the examination in colors.

AN ONLY OR FIRST MATE—An only mate must be nineteen years of age, and must have served five years at sea.
