made in the Report as to the cause of this deficiency, it may be traced to the absence of those extraordinary efforts which were made last year in the shape of concerts, teas and socials. The Missionary of Acton is buoyed up with the hope that the opening of the South Eastern Railroad will materially advance the interests of the Church in Acton.

BISHOP'S COLLEGE MISSIONS.

Bishop's College Missions are Moulton Hill, Ascot Corner, Westbury, Mitchells, Sand Hill, Milby, Libby's Mills and Island Brook, employing eleven students in the work. The Report of the Professor of Pastoral Theology is full of interest and will appear in the Annual Report of the Parent Society.

Barford presents a decrease of \$200.20 this year. The congregation at Norton and Stanhope has been reduced from forty to eight families. At Dixville there is a very promising Sunday School.
