

No Faith in Madero.

No Faith in Madero.

First reports that Madero had agreed today to the appointment of a president ad interim would have been received as welcome news by the administration leaders here, but, recalling the repudiation by Madero last week of the promise to De La Barra to resign if called upon to do so by the senate, they considered the news with caution. They were fearful that in this instance Madero had attached impossible conditions to any promise of withdrawal.

Ground for this apprehension was found in the peculiar statement that Madero had accepted "in principle" the idea of a president pro tempore, which was taken to mean that he reserved the right to prescribe the details of the plan, such, for instance, as the designation of his own successor. Later news that Madero had offered only to end the administration of his cabinet and vice-president, prompted the conclusion here that he was only sparring for advantage and that the disintegration of his forces, understood to be going on constantly, would soon force him to an understanding.
