CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

Sales of the coming season's cut are becoming more frequent. Numerous buyers are visiting the leading producing points and taking an inventory of stocks on hand and to be cut. Where excessive prices are not asked a disposition is shown to close contracts, as in some quarters it is predicted that there will be an early advance in some of the lower grades of pine lumber. It is clearly evident that dealers are accumulating stocks at every opportunity in anticipation of an active spring trade. After the spring requirements are supplied, there may be a slight weakening in prices, but no person looks for any decline before midsummer. If trade should expand to the extent that now seems probable, the demand would likely be sufficient to sustain the present range of values well through the year. Pine culls are moving more freely. The shingle market is steady, with the demand somewhat quiet. No new features have developed in the hardwood market. The number of enquiries received is daily increasing, indicating a decided shortage of stocks in the hands of dealers and consumers. Before the new cut is ready for the market there will doubtless have developed a famine in stock such as has not been known for some time, and a higher range of values seems imminent. Satisfactory progress is being made with logging operations.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The buying of spruce lumber has indicated that present prices are likely to be maintained. Dealers have bought quite heavily for export to Great Britain, and the cuts of the leading mills have passed out of first hands. The lower grades have come into prominence on account of increased buying by box concerns and for shipment to the Eastern States. Shippers are asking increased prices for square and waxy timber. They anticipate a good demand and strong market throughout the year. There is no particular change in New Brunswick stock. Cedar shingles are rather quiet, but the price of \$3.50 for extras on Boston rate of freight is still the average selling figure. Laths are slightly weaker on account of lower quotations from New York.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Many of the dealers are now visiting the lumbering producing points for the purpose of purchasing their supplies for the coming season. It is predicted; even at this early date, that the mills will be unable to supply the demand for lumber in the west. Arrangements are being made to
