Nearly a Million Shares Changed Hands in Montreal Last Month.

MINING STOCKS IN THE VAN

And the Trading Was Confined Principally to Three of the Big Companies.

War Eagle Was a Large Factor, Was Done in Railway Shares Also, With the Canadian Paciale in the Foremost Place-Toronto Railway Was Also a Favorite.

Montreal, March 1. -(Special.)-The sale of stocks on the Montreal Stock Exchange during the past month totalled very nearly 949,116, compared with 444,018 for the month of January, which, it will be remembered, was a very busy, in fact a

The excess of the February business over January was 505,098 shares. Mining shares led the van by a large majority. the sales amounting to 810,535 shares, compared with 967 bank shares. The past four weeks of business was a recordbreaker so far as the mining group was concerned, all the trading being done in the shares of three companies, namely, War Eagle, Payne and Montreal and London. The last two were not listed until the month was well advanced, yet Payne was dealt in to aimost as many snares as the total of January's business, or 422,700 snares in ail. War Eagle came next with 216,300 shares and Montreal and London 171,535 shares.

The Railway Stocks. Next to the miners, Canadian Pacific was most extensively dealt in, 36,721 shares being sold, but the enhancement in value was very deliberate, compared with others, 5% points, aithough it lost 1% points, making the net gain for the month 4 noints. points, making the net gain for the month 4 points.

Twin City, the Minneapolis and St. Paul Street Railway security, ranked next in volume of business to Canadian Pacific, 28,650 shares in all being sold, the advance being 8½ points, with a break in the last few days to the extent of a point and a quarter, making the set increase 7 points.

Teronto Street Railway was also a speculative favorite, a gain of 5 points being made on a total of 13,268 shares sold.

Interest in Duluth, south Shore and Atlantic Railway shares was revived during the month on the strength of the earnings of the company, and 11,855 of the combined commen and preferred snares changed hands at slightly advanced values.
