Wednesday Evening, March 22. Liverpool wheat futures to-day rallied and closed 1d to 11/sd per cental above yesterday's final figures.

Paris wheat closed unchanged to 10 cen-times for the day, with flour irregular. Chicago wheat futures advanced over a cent to-day and closed near the top figure of the session. The improved cables started the rise and these were followed by reports of damage to crops in the Southwest. The buying was pretty general. This is, the season when damage talk is made the most of to advance prices, but until these fully materialize higher prices do not seem to be warranted by legitimate conditions. The July option figured increasingly in to-day's trading.


