CIVIC FUEL IN SIGHT.

How to Get Civic Fuel

A family with only money enough to buy one stick of wood at a time will get that stick at the same price in proportion, as the man receiving the limit. In other words, the net cost of the wood in all quantities will be the same to all people.

A complete record of each sale will be made, the name, number of residence and quantity being recorded in the City Treasurer's office. This will prevent any effort to "corner" the supply.

Persons desiring fuel from the city supply must go to the City Hall and deposit the price with the City Treasurer. Thereupon, he will issue an order upon the city supply yard nearest to the customer to be supplied. Delivery will be made from the city yards, but every cusomer must secure his own delivery, agons. This is intended to permit or persons, owning vehicles, to handle their own delivery. Wagons can be hired by applying at the yards.
