

Swayse, employed by a life insuran ection, to-day shot Miss Effie Alvord twice, in the neck and wrist, not fatally, while the couple were in a private office in the company's suite on the eleventh floor of the Chamber of Commerce building, and then jumped from the window himself. Swayse had attempted to throw Miss Alvord from the window, but failed.

Miss Alvord had asked to have a private interview with Swayse. In a few moments persons in the office heard a struggle and several pistol shots. Manager McCall rushed against the door and broke it open. Miss Alvord was prostrated on the floor. Thru the window he saw Swayse's hands clutching the window ledge, but only for a moment. Then Swayse let go.

He hit several wires and turned over twice, striking on the face and chest.

A bullet wound in his nose showed that
he had also shot himself before taking the awful plunge. There was just a breath of life in the body when it was picked up.

Miss Alvord worked at the House of Correction when Swayse was assistant superintendent there.

Occupants of the building across the street saw Swayse attempt to throw Miss Alvord out of the window. Here head and shoulders were across the ledge and she was fighting desperately. Then the couple disappeared from the window and the shots were heard.

A letter written by Swayse alleges that Miss Alvord and Swayse had been intimate; that the intimacy was responsible for Swayse's losing his position at the House of Correction, and that Miss Alvord had been hounding him.

Miss Alvord sent word to the reporters that yesterday was her 28th birthday and that Swayse sent her a telephone message that he was going to shoot her as a birthday present. She said she went to Swayse's office to-day to break with him.

Swayse was 53 years of age and leaves a widow and two children.
