

Pittsburg, May 24.—(Special.)—The first awards under the Carnegie hero fund of \$5,700,000, created by Andrew Carnegie in April, 1904, were made to-day.

Among those receiving silver medals is Alexander Cameron, aged 27, a painter, of Lindsay, Victoria Co., Ont. Cameron saw George H. Bryans, aged 8, fall into the Scugog River while attempting to catch fish. He jumped in after the boy, who had sunk twice.
