FIFTY APPLY DAILY FOR ADMISSION TO CANADIAN AIR FORCE

Department Is Getting Camp Borden Ready For Training.

OTTAWA, April 9.—(By Canadian Press).—Applications are coming in at the rate of fifty and sixty a day for enlistment in the new Canadian air force. All the applications are from ex-officers in the Royal Air Forces.

Preparations are already under way at Camp Borden, Ontario, for the establishment of the first training camp of the force. Officers of the new force will train at Camp Borden in periods of a month or so at a time. There are adequate facilities there for the training of nearly three thousand men at a time.

The equipment installed by the Royal Air Forces at Camp Borden has been taken over by the Canadian Government for the use of the Canadian air force, including fifteen hangars and a substantial permanent building. The building of this flying base cost the Imperial Government \$1,000,000, and comprises an up-to-date aerodrome and barracks.

TWO IRISH PICKETS REFUSE BOND AND ARE SENT TO JAIL

Women Received Hearing Before Commissioners.

WASHINGTON, April 9.—Refusing bond offered by counsel, two of the Irish pickets arrested yesterday for picketing the British Embassy, Misses Mary Galvin of Philadelphia, and Maura Quinn of Jamaica Plain, Mass., today were committed to jail after preliminary hearing before United States Commissioner Richardson.

The third of the trio arrested, Miss Katharine McKoon of Philadelphia, gave bond in the sum of \$1,000, and was released until Monday when the cases of the seven women thus far arrested will be called.

Picketing the embassy was not resumed today, it being planned to transfer the scene of protest to the treasury department.

WHO WILL RECEIVE SALARY FOR LEADER OF ONT. OPPOSITION?

Ferguson and Dewart, Both Leaders, Cause Dilemma.

TORONTO, April 9.—The problem of the dual leadership of the Opposition in the Ontario Legislature is still unsolved. Ruling that the Opposition is composed of two distinct parties, each with a leader of its own, Hon. Nelson Parlman, speaker, has refused to recognize H. Dewart as sole leader of the Opposition, and has given as his decision that Messrs. Dewart and Ferguson are equal leaders.

"This arises the question, to whom the salary voted last session for the leader of the Opposition will be paid. The statute reads that 'the sum of \$5,000 shall be payable to that member of the Opposition recognized by the Speaker as leader of the Opposition.'"

Whether, under the ruling now given by the speaker, the salary should be divided between the Liberal and Conservative leaders, remaining a matter of conjecture, and an amendment to the statute will probably be required in order to settle the problem.

KITCHENER VETERANS REMEMBER VIMY RIDGE ANNIVERSARY BANQUET

General H. A. Panet, G.O.C. M. D. No. 1, and District Officers Attend.

KITCHENER, April 9.—Kitchener returned soldiers were given a banquet by Mayor Eden and the city council here tonight, in honor of the anniversary of the battle of Vimy Ridge. The affair was historic, and over one thousand soldiers sat down to a spread which was prepared by the Daughters of the Empire. Speeches were made by General Panet, D.S.O., G.O.C. M. D. No. 1, London, who responded to the toast of "Our Soldiers." The toast "Canada" was responded to by Major Corriall, M.B.O., M.C., of London, and proposed by Capt. Rousley, Croix de Guerre, of Kitchener. "Our Guests" was proposed by Major Richardson, D.S.O., of Kitchener, and responded to by Capt. John McCrae of Galt. Capt. Greaves and Capt. Kennedy of Kitchener spoke to the toast to the ladies.
