

Ontario Govt. Will Pay Third of Idle Relief

Raney Announces That Province Will Assume Share of Burden.

Toronto, Dec. 20.—One-third of the amount spent by the municipalities of the province of Ontario on emergency relief this winter will be contributed by the Ontario Government, provided the other two-thirds is paid either by the municipalities or the municipalities and Dominion Government jointly, according to an announcement made here tonight by Attorney-General Raney.

SNOWFALL AT WROXETER HEAVIEST IN MANY YEARS

Downfall Was Local — Surrounding Districts Have Little Snow.

Wroxeter, Dec. 21.—What is claimed by old residents of this vicinity to be one of the heaviest snowfalls of snow for years to occur in a few hours fell here Friday night, making the roads almost impassable. The rural mail men were unable to cover their routes on Saturday. A remarkable feature is that the fall of snow seems quite local, as a few miles east of the village there is not enough snow for good sleighing.

MAYOR OF GALT IS PRESENTED WITH CHAIR

Fire Loss During Year Totalled \$12,000 — Mayor A. W. Mercer Retires.

Galt, Dec. 21.—The city council, at its final meeting of the year tonight, received satisfactory reports from the various spending bodies. The Chief Keyes, in his annual report, showed that the city's fire loss this year was \$12,000. There were 27 alarms during the year. The chief recommended the purchase of a motor hose truck. Building permits for the year totalled 192, value \$21,760.

BRANTFORD VETERANS WANT WORK, NOT RELIEF

City Has Overdraft of \$19,000 on the Year's Work.

Brantford, Dec. 21.—Representatives of 200 unemployed veterans appeared before the city council tonight and appealed for immediate action to give the veterans work. Eight per cent of these were able-bodied, willing to tackle any kind of work, and do not want relief. Sewer construction, which will keep 50 men at work, is being ordered, and new work will be laid out at the earliest possible date.

PERJURY COSTS BULGARIAN \$1,000 AND MONTH IN JAIL

Drunkenness Stands Would Be Burial in Good Stead.

Kitchener, Dec. 21.—George E. Conomoff, Bulgarian restaurant proprietor, found guilty of perjury, was sentenced today by Judge Hearn to one month in jail and a fine of \$1,000. An attempt to burglarize the hardware store of George Bucher at an early hour this morning was frustrated by the police. The burglar when caught was found to be drunk. As the store had not been entered the man, who is a local plumber's mechanic, was fined for drunkenness.
