

Will Bar Fraternity Players
Montreal, Jan. 24.—A movement to bar all members of the Baseball Players' Fraternity from the Montreal Baseball Club will be taken at the special meeting of the International League to be held next month, it was announced on Wednesday by Pres. Lichtenheim of the Montreal club. If the league sanctions his move he says he will ask all his players to abandon the fraternity or else offer them such small contracts as to force them out of baseball.
