The soldier, one of the Royal Scots Regiment, fell in action at Monchy-le-Preux, East Arras, between April and June 1917. This postal order clue was found to be issued at Clarbourough, Ratford, Nottinghamshire, on March 20, 1917, and the postmistress there was asked whether she might be acquainted with anyone who might be able to supply information likely to lead to the identification. The postmistress was a distant relative of a soldier in the Royal Scots Regt. who fought at Monchy-le-Preux, being first reported missing and later presumed killed. She went to the parents of this soldier, and when the facts were revealed they at once realized that the body was that of their son, Private J. W. Stevenson.
