Coal \$1.50 Higher,
Predicts League

Miners Warn That Food Must be Re-
duced—Dinner for Man and Family of
Seven Costs \$6.05—Daily Wage
\$5

Potsville, Penn., July 23—Adding to
the warning made to Congress that the
price of coal may jump \$5 a ton because
of its scarcity, a statement has been for-
warded to Senators Reed, Jones and New
Mexico and Kenyon, that anthracite
coal is almost certain to be increased
\$1.50 a ton by the first of next April. If
food prices are not reduced, the sena-
tors were on the senate sub-committee
on manufacture which investigated the
anthracite industry.

The warning is conveyed by the An-
thracite Consumers' League, which was
instrumental in starting the investiga-
tion. The cause for the rise is the de-
mand for an increased wage scale by the
miners amounting to 20 per cent and a
reduction in hours from eight to six.
