Coal \$1.50 Higher,
Predicts League

Miners Warn That Food Must be Re-
duced—Dinner for Man and Family
of Seven Costs \$6.05—Daly Wage
\$5

Potsville, Penn., July 23—Adding to
the warning made to Congress that the
price of coal may jump \$5 a ton because
of its scarcity, a statement has been for-
warded to Senators Reed, Jones of New
Mexico and Kenyon, that anthracite
coal is almost certain to be increased
\$1.00 a ton by the first of next April. If
food prices are not reduced, the price
of coal will rise from eight to six-
teen cents, but a reduction in the price
of food and clothing can satisfy the
demand of the miners, says the league.
