EIGHT FACE CHARGES OF ATTEMPTED MURDER

Two Manslaughter Cases Also in Montreal—Court Session Opened Today

Montreal, Nov. 2.—In the Court of King's Bench, which opened today there are eight charges of attempted murder and two of manslaughter.

Among the former are two by the name of the city, that in which Nicholas Hayes is held for slaying at Juliette street, in St. Elizabeth street and the other, in which three suspects, John Decker, Jack Sowie and Andrew Smith are similarly held in regard to an attack on Mrs. Jette, Harry Andushio, Pietro Lazzaro and Antonio Romano will also have to stand trial for attempted murder.
