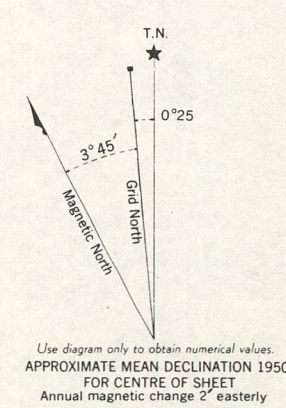

CONVERSION SCALE FOR ELEVATION

The scale consists of two horizontal axes. The top axis is labeled 'Metres' and has major tick marks at 0, 50, 100, 150, 200, 250, and 300.
