

WASHINGTON, Jan, 29—Mrs. Jennie
L. May, indicted for assault with intent to kill, was placed on trial today for the shooting of Lucien Conen, a former member of the Marine Band. The shooting occurred September 27, 1905, and after lying in a helpless condition until October last, Conen died while at the home of his mother in Louisville, Ky. Because Conen lived more than a year and a day after being shot, Mrs. May, under the law could not be charged with murder or manslaughter, and her indictment on the charge of assault with intent to kill was returned by the Grand Jury, soon after Conen died.
