Pobledonostseff, for many years the strongest single force in Russia, is dead. As the companion and tutor of two Czars, his personal influence was great, even before he became the Procurator of the Holy Russian Synod, which office is the highest in the Greek Church. His personal influence and his official position were backed up by a trained intellect of very high order, and by an absolute sincerity that would have made him suffer persecutions as readily as he inflicted them ch Roman Catholics, Lutherans, and Doukhobors. It was Pobledonostseff who drove the latter out of Russia; and it was Pobledonostseff who was responsible for many of the anti-Semitic outbreaks. He was the best hated man in Russia.

THE MODERN TORQUEMADA.

"The Modern Torquemada" is the name Pobiedonstseff won for himself, and for bitter, religious intolerance he had no peer among the leaders of our time; but anyone who imagines Pobiedonostseff to have been a conscious scoundrel does him an injustice. Gen. Booth is not more convinced that he is doing a good work in raising the fallen, and preaching and practising Christianity, than was Pobiedonostseff when he persecuted the Jews and when he persecute.
