DOCTOR KEEPS WORD;
MAKES WOMEN YOUNG

Ancient Dames Lose Many Years in Forty-eight Hours.

LONDON, May 15.—The British Medical Journal declares that a German doctor has discovered a means of restoring lost youth to women, which is more potent than Cagliostro's famous Pentacle rejuvenescence. The physician advertised that he could in two days rejuvenate the most decrepit dame. This brought scores of ancient dames to his house.
At the first interview he invited each patient to write her surname and Christian name and age on a piece of paper. The ages to which the women pleaded guilty varied, but all ruled high. The doctor undertook to give each patient the promised elixir the next day, but some time was required to adjust the strength to the individual power of resistance.
On the appointed day the women called again, but the doctor expressed regret that he had unfortunately mislaid the papers containing their ages. For this reason, he said, a new set would be required. He added casually that they ought to know that the oldest of them must allow herself to be burned for the good of the rest, as the basis for the remedy was human ash. Next day the women brought back papers with their ages on. It was found that each had taken many years off the age previously admitted.
Then the doctor, pretending to have found the first papers, called them to witness the success of his invention. Comparing the lists, he showed that he had kept his word in regard to rejuvenation because in forty-eight hours they had all grown many years younger.

A BRUTAL MURDER

Aged German Confesses to Having Killed Companion During Quarrel.

PORTLAND, Ore., May 15.—William Bloss, an aged German, confessed to having killed his companion, Philander Lemmon, near Roseburg, in a cabaret in which both occupied during a quarrel, originating in Lemmon having snored loudly and disturbed Bloss. Bloss has the reputation of being quarrelsome.
According to Bloss' confession, Lemmon attempted to strike him with an axe, a scuffle followed, which resulted in Bloss obtaining the axe, and he struck Lemmon a blow on the head that killed him instantly. He buried the body in a ditch near the cabin. Bloss was recently an inmate of a poor farm and showed symptoms of insanity.

FOILED THREE TIMES,
ELOPERS FINALLY WED

Young Pittsburg Lovers Win in Battle of Wits Lasting a Year.

PITTSBURG, May 15.—After making three attempts to elope to Youngstown, Ohio, without success, during the last year, Miss Gertrude Pinner, aged 20, of the West End, and James Kalkanborn, aged 22, eloped Saturday, and were married at Youngstown that afternoon.
Miss Pinner, who had been so closely watched, got away with her lover, before they could be stopped. She invited her mother and younger sister to attend a matinee with her, gave them the tickets, and said she would meet them in the theatre. Mrs. Pinner and her younger daughter, took in the show, but Gertrude came not.
When mother and daughter reached home Mrs. Gertrude Kalkanborn was calling on the phone from Youngstown, asking forgiveness.

FRANCE GROWING POORER.

Conclusions Based on Official Returns of the Succession Duties.

LONDON, May 15.—Either France has been growing steadily poorer during the last decade or her capital is being increasingly drained abroad. These alternatives have been reached by the distinguished statistician, Deconville, a member of the Institute, who incines toward the former. His conclusions are based on the official returns of the succession duty, the sums given as dowries being also taken into account. The figures giving the amount on which duty was paid are available since 1866, when the average for the following five years shows a steady increase. Even the Franco-Prussian war caused no diminution in the average, that of 1868-72 being \$24,000, as against \$1,000,000 from 1871 to 1875.
This increase continued until the average was reached in the period from 1881 to 1885 of \$1,258,000. As wealth was then increasing in all countries and there was no reason to fear that its development would be checked in France, it was expected that the average would reach \$1,600,000 for the next five years, whereas the period from 1886 to 1890 yielded only \$1,373,000. That this increase was not merely temporary is shown by the latest five years for which figures are available, 1891-95, when the average reached only \$1,323,400.
