

OCTOBER SESSIONS  
OF ALBERT COURT

Albert, Albert County, Oct. 27.—The October sessions of the Albert county court were opened at eleven o'clock this morning. His Honor Judge Jonah presiding. A court stenographer was present for the first time. Thomas McCollough having been appointed to the office. Daniel Mullin, of St. John, was present as representing the Attorney General. A. W. Barry and M. B. Dixon, of the local bar, were present.

After the judge had taken his seat on the bench, Mr. Mullin addressed the court and stated that he appeared to represent the Attorney General and take charge of the criminal business. In regard to the case of the King against Downing, charged with attempting murder by poisoning, he had looked carefully into the evidence taken before the Magistrate, and considering the gravity of the charge and what the evidence disclosed, he was of the opinion that the county court had no jurisdiction to try the case, and he would not present any indictment before the grand jury now assembled.

His Honor the Judge in addressing the grand jury, said to them that he would not have them sworn. He thanked them for their presence and spoke a few words on the subject of the war. There being no other case ready for trial the court was adjourned to November 17 next. Mr. Mullin returned home by the noon train from Hillsboro, over until Wednesday.

After the court had adjourned M. B. Dixon applied to His Honor for an order for bail for the prisoner, which was granted. The prisoner himself in \$1,000 and S. W. Stewart and Alfred A. Porter in \$500 each, conditionally on his appearing to take trial at the circuit court to be held at Hopewell Cape.

THE SOLE AGENT OF A FAMILY, or any male over 18 years old, may home-stead a quarter-section of available land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A homesteader who is a cultivator, and whose residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter-section of his homestead, Price \$3.00 per acre. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homesteaded patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Livestock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-  
WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years, renewable at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2,000 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. In unreserved territory, the tract must be staked out by the applicant in person, and personal application to the Mining Recorder, who \$500.00 has been paid for the district, must in case he made and the rental for the first year must be paid to the agent within thirty days after staking application.

PLACER MINING—Claims are 600 feet long and from 1,000 to 2,000 feet wide. Entry fee \$5. Not less than \$100 must be expended in development work each year.

DEVELOPING—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 2 years. Rental \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 1-1/2 per cent. after the output exceeds 10,000.
