VANCOUVER LOST

TO TORONTO BLUES
Third Game of Stanley Cup Series—The Score 6 to 3—Visitors All But Outclassed.

Toronto, March 26.—Toronto blues forged to the front in the world's hockey series tonight, when they defeated Vancouver 6 to 3, in the third game for the Stanley Cup. The contest was played under national hockey league rules, and the Blues, who attended strictly to their knitting throughout, indulging in little rough play, all but outclassed the visitors. As in the initial game of the series, Toronto showed their overwhelming superiority at the six men style. They accumulated a 3 to 0 lead in the first period and kept their advantage throughout, though at one stage Vancouver reduced the lead to two goals.

The winners excelled in combination and back-checking and earned all goals. Two of the westerners' counters were practically gifts, Taylor taking passes when camped in the goal mouth. McKay as formerly, was conspicuous, but he was watched closely by Skinner, and at times showed his displeasure at the latter's persistent attention by much slashing. Lehman's work in goal bordered on the marvelous. He had three times the work that Holmes was called upon to do, and he undoubtedly saved the visitors from a much worse beating. Many penalties were imposed, mostly for minor offences. There was little rowdiness exhibited, the officials being strict and impartial. Cameron, Skinner and Munnery were the Blues' best performers, while Denny scintillated at times. The crowd was large.

Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who at the commencement of the present year, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of land in each of three years.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$200.00.

Homesteaders may count time of employment as farm laborers in Canada during 1917, as residence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned soldiers who have served overseas and have been honorably discharged, may obtain day priority in applying for entry at local Agency's Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.
