There are three of these latter institutions which are maintained by the earnings of the railroad men. The first, which is supported by a mutual society of employees of the Moscow-Novgorod road, is a large and comfortable building planned for. On the Kieft-Ozernoy road there is a library car, but only a reading room was provided. The third is a school for employees' children, in places where there are no public schools. There are 32 technical schools, and 100,000 men and boys are taking technical and trade training. 6,000 Russian young men have graduated from these schools. Many of the young men are now locomotive engineers. There are many railroads, churches, and the priest is on the road pay roll. On the Trans-Siberian road, for example, the priest of the Siberian Railroad also has one. In the railroad shops there is a stage with theatrical performances. Everywhere there are many dance houses, provided by the railroad for the employees. On the line from Moscow to the coast (not to the Black Sea) several new buildings are being put at division points for reading rooms and libraries.
