SPANISH DEFEAT IN CUBA. Eate advices from Cuba give the details of the defeat of the Spanish troops near Puerto Principe. The Spaniards lost 80 killed and two officers, and 40 horses captured. This defeat was twisted by the Spanish officials in Havana into a victory, and glowing accounts of the bravery of the Spanish forces in resisting the attack by superior numbers were published.

Special to the Tribune. Mr. Huntington Refuses to Appear Before the Royal Commission and Swear to his Assertions—The Commission denounced as Illegal.

OTTAWA, Aug. 27.

The Toronto Globe to-day publishes letter from Mr. Huntington giving his reasons for refusing to appear before the Royal Commission. He acknowledges the receipt of the Commissioners' letter, and proceeds to say that, as a member of the Commons, he made charges against Ministers which Parliament determine to investigate, and the determination o ent with his duties, and a breach of Parliamentary privileges, to acknowledge any inferior or exceptional tribunal creat ed to enquire into charges still pending before the Commons: He believes the creation of the Commission a violation of the fundamental principles of the constitution. It is without precedent, unknown to the common law, unsupported by statutary enactment, and providing by the exercise of the Executive prerogative of justice into misdemeanors cognizable Commission is, consequently, illegal.
