Re: Questions Raised by the Speaker of the Students' Council With Respect to Slates and the Chief Returning Officer's Election Report. During the Discipline, Interpretation and Enforcement (D.I.E.) Board meeting of 10 March 1982, the following recommendations

were made. (1) A slate may be referred to on the ballot by any identifying name followed by the word 'slate'. The identifying name cannot be construed as a campaign slogan and should a problem arise with respect to this, it shall be left to the discretion of the Chief Returning

Officer of the Students' Union. (2) One (1) person cannot be considered a slate, pursuant to

Section 2 (b) of Bylaw 300. (3) Section 32 of Bylaw 300 should be clarified to state that the Chief Returning Officer of the Students' Union shall submit, within seven (7) days after all charges and appeals have been heard and decided, to the Speaker of the Students' Coincil a report in writing containing the final results of the election.


