PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TOTHE UNB STUDENT UNIONFINANCIAL POLICY

KIMBERLEY DOYLE FINANCE COMMITTEE

This policy will be effective for all Student Union related advertising sales, including those of the Brunswickan, CHSR, Signboard, etc. the terms of the policy were decided as follows

- 1. First time creditors with over one hundred dollars (\$100.00) in purchases will be required to pay either fifty percent (50%) or one hundred dollars (\$100.00) up front, whichever is the higher amount.
- 2. First time creditors with less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) in purchases will be required to pay one hundred percent (100%) up front.
- 3. Any creditor who pays in full within ten (10) days of purchase will receive a discount of two percent (2%).
- 4. The Net amount of the purchase will be required to be remitted within thirty (30) days of purchase.
- 5. The balance of any creditors account not paid within thirty (30) days of purchase will be subject to interest charges of twenty four percent (24%) per annum, or two percent (2%) per month.
- 6. Special consideration may be given to creditors in excellent standing (i.e. established, high volume purchasers).
- 7. Exceptions made of any of these policies must be approved by the Student Union Comptroller.
- 8. A creditor will be deemed a creditor in poor standing if he does not remit the balance of his account within ninety (90) days of purchase. After such a time, said creditor will be subject to the policies applied to First time creditors, as well as being required to remit the balance of his account immediately.
- 9. A creditor who qualifies as a creditor in poor standing more than once will therefore be required to make payments in full for any and all purchases, until he has repented for his sins.

The Student Union Shall:

- j) ADD: "Which shall be \$5.00 / breakfast, \$5.00 / lunch, \$10.00 / dinner (\$20.00 / day) for meals \$0.24 / km for mileage. Cost of lodgings to be determined after reasonable investigation of possible accommodations."

- g.) SHOULD READ: "Any organization recognized by the Student Union may be required to make all purchases in excess of \$200.00 by a UNB Foundation Purchase Order."
- ADD: 3) "Any recognized club or society may be subject to an audit by the V-P (Finance & Administration) or the Finance Committee."

The Student Union Council Shall:

ADD: n.) "Ensure that all clubs and societies are aware of the Student Union's Financial Policy and its regulations."

Petty Cash:

4.) FIRST SENTENCE SHOULD READ: "An initial cheque of no more than \$50.00 will be issued to the treasurer, in the name of the organization concerned, to be drawn upon that organization's student Union Account."

Budget Submissions:

2.) SHOULD READ: "Budgets shall include the names and phone numbers of the club executives, and the address of the club office."

Funding:

ADD: 6.) "The Union shall not provide direct funding to a charity, however, the Union will consider supporting student run events in which any proceeds are directed towards a charity."
