

# Holland wins race in a walk

Mandy Holland and Cassel Miles had a doubly satisfying time at the Ontario Bantam, Midget and Juvenile track and field Championships last weekend at Nelson Stadium in Burlington.

Holland and Miles of the Mississauga Track and Field Club achieved personal best times in winning their respective events. Holland won the juvenile girls 1500 metre race-walk in 7:52.2. Miles took top honors in the midget boys 400-metre hurdles in 57.5. Miles also placed third in the midget 100-metre hurdles in 14.4.

Charmaine Curvan won the bantam girls long jump with a leap of 5.0 metres. She finished fourth in the bantam 100 metres in 13.2.

Other Mississauga Track Club members missed out on first place.

John Rendeiro finished second in the juvenile 1500 metres steeplechase in 4:32.3 and placed fourth in the juvenile 3000 in 9:04.5. Joan Bender took second in the juvenile 1500 race-walk in 7:28.0, while Lisa Greenlee placed third in the juvenile 3000 in 10:28.1.

Carl Burrell took second in the juvenile boys 1500 in 8:48.5.

Ian Neita placed sixth in both the bantam boys 100 and 200 in 13.7 and 26.08 respectively. Gary Leeson placed second in the midget 400 in 52.5, while Terrance Phipps finished third in both the midget 400 and 200 in 53.0 and 23.6 respectively.

Phipps' sister Angela, placed fourth in the midget

100 in 12.6, followed in fifth place by Carol Plummer in 12.6. Plummer also placed third in the midget 200 metres in 25.6.

Tim Breadner placed second in both the midget 100 and 200 in 11.3 and 23.6 respectively. Chris Brandy also took second place in the juvenile 100 metres in 11.2 and third in the midget long jump with a leap of 6.82 metres.

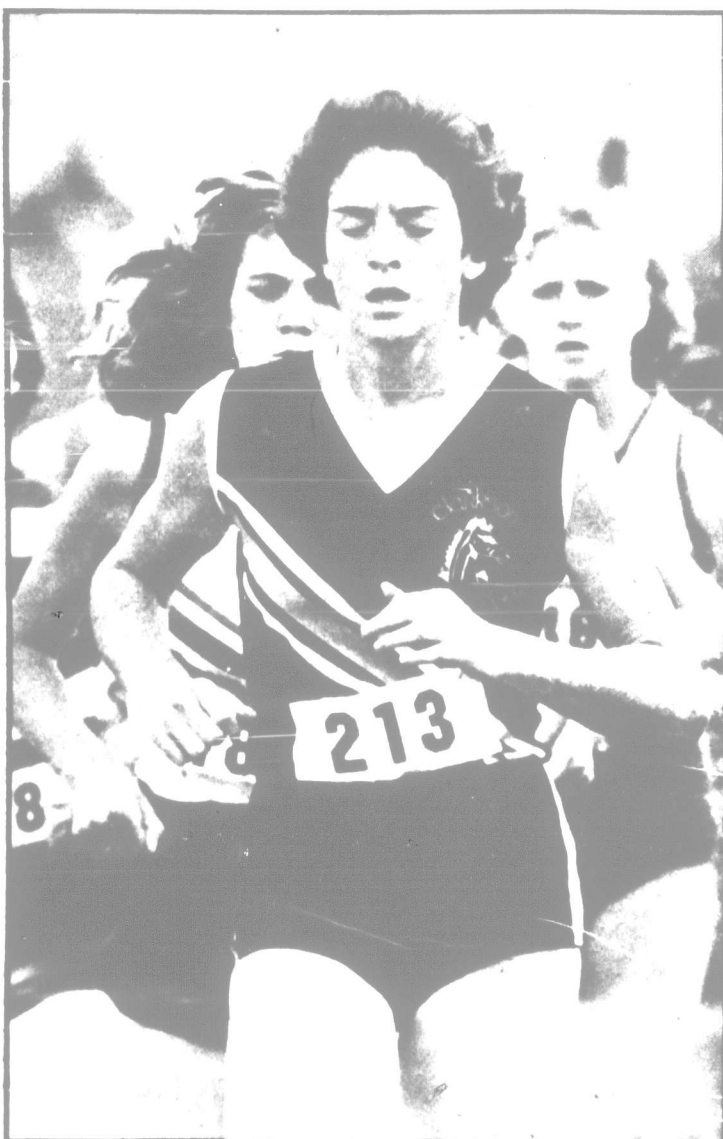
Cynthia Thomas placed fifth in the bantam 800 in 2.29.

In the field events, Al MacKenzie placed second in the midget hammer with Don Ferry hurling the javelin 53.26 metres to place fourth in juvenile action. Andrew Brandy placed third in the bantam triple jump with a leap of 11.10 metres.

Tim Ayiotis finished fourth in the midget shot put with a toss of 14.58 metres. Ornella Cavin placed third in the midget discus with a personal best of 35.15 metres. And in the midget javelin, Sue Maracle finished third with a throw of 32.10 metres.

Sue Almond finished fourth in the midget javelin with a throw of 30.50. Sue's sister Lindsay, placed fourth in the midget high jump with a leap of 1.50 metres.

Mississauga Track and Field Club will represent the Western League at the Ontario League Championships September 7 at York University. Mississauga won the Western League championship by 600 points over second-place Burlington.

Sterkin didn't have any substitutes to replace the injured duo.

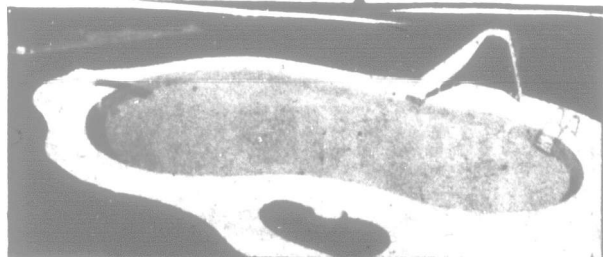
"Malton played well," said Sterkin, "but if we had had a full team we would have whipped them."

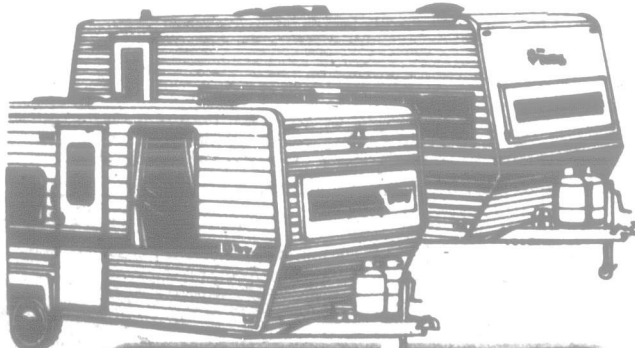
