

four Schools in operation among  
 the Indians of your Agency, namely,  
 one at St. Regis where you reside,  
 another at the Chippewais, and two  
 on Cornwall Island. one of the  
 latter is a Roman Catholic and  
 the other a Protestant institution,  
 the latter being conducted under  
 the auspices of the Methodist  
 Church. The reports from the three  
 last Schools are, I am glad to say,  
 on the whole satisfactory; but I  
 regret that I cannot say as much  
 for the School at St. Regis. You  
 should use your utmost efforts  
 to induce the parents of the  
 Indian children to send them  
 to these Institutions, and the  
 Returns of the attendance at the  
 Schools should be forwarded by  
 I the
