

Sir,

Referring to your Requisition for December last, asking for Patent for Lot 28, fronting on the St. John River, Tobique, in the name of Charles Hanson, I have to inform you that this Lot stands, except the portion between the Railway and the St. John River, by Assignment, in the name of Charles E. Hanson. It will, therefore, be necessary to file an Assignment in the Department from Charles E. Hanson to Charles Hanson, or furnish a written statement showing that Charles E. Hanson and Charles Hanson, are one and the same person, if such is the case, and also to state which is the correct name of the applicant for Patent. In this connection I have to direct your attention to letter to your ~~brother~~ of the 25th August, 1900, and to state that before Patent can issue, it will be necessary to collect and forward to the Department, the \$4.41 referred to therein, as a charge against the Lot, on account of Timber Dues, together with Interest @ 6 % thereon, from the date of that letter until paid. Hereafter a covering letter should accompany your Returns.
