The Dept. however, thought that this was too liberal an arrangement for the Doctor, and accordingly it was modified, and in addition to the arrangement suggested by him he was required to pay a monthly visit to the House

I think you will certainly agree with me that this was a more favorable arrangement for the Indians than Dr. Reid's original offer

I may add that for any special cases, which the Doctor may be called <sup>upon to attend</sup> within the interval between the monthly visits, he is to be paid extra. I may therefore say with regard
