- (5) Choose the leader himself and himself as the leader.
- (6) Baptize the candidates himself then leave the rest to the electorate.
- Well, what happened as a consequence?

 Mr. Stevens himself was returned.

 Not one of Mr. Stevens' candidates was elected.
- Did you ever think of what, as a consequence, became of the party, of its name, of its platform, of the promises, of the leader himself?
- It might be well, for those who are being carried away by the name National Government, by Dr. Manion's many promises, to think of that between now and Easter Monday.
- But let me mention another possibility.

 Mr. Stevens is a classical example of what good a leader, without a following, may be in carrying out platform promises.
- But there is another possibility.

 Unlike the party and his followers, Mr. Stevens himself was lucky. He was returned to Parliament. But, suppose he had not been returned, what then?
