(6) Edward SCHULFORTH, Answay.
33 Route 1, Newark, N.J. (Identified Cpl. Maloney and Pte. Gibson).
At about 12:30 hrs. on the 19th February, 1945, Schulforth was in the Cafe Normandie, Newark Street, when two soldiers entered carrying pistols in their hands. They took his wallet and wrist watch, and also stole from other persons in the Cafe.

(7) No. 1039, 740 Pte. WILSON, N.J.
33 East Orange Boulevard, N.J. (Identified Cpl. Maloney and Pte. Gibson).
At 10:30 hrs. about the end of January, 1945, Pte. Fisher was in the New York Bar, Schuyler Street, when three American soldiers entered and ordered some drinks without paying for same. One of these soldiers hit the owner of the Cafe on the face, pulled out a pistol and demanded more drinks. The owner became frightened and ran away, when the soldiers took from him three bottles of wine and a number of bottles of beer.

(8) Milvonne Van Oyen, Answay.
4 Republica Street, Answay. (Identified Pte. Gibson).
At 20:15 hrs. on the 19th November, 1944, at the corner of Kamen Street and Republica Street, Van Oyen was attacked by three soldiers. They took her handbag containing two purses, 740 French Marriage Book, glasses, and other articles.

(9) Ed. Franciskus LOUIN, Answay.
6 Van Schooten Street, Answay. (Identified Pte. Lankovich).
At 20:30 hrs. on the 30th January, 1945, two soldiers entered the above address and started fighting with the owner. One of the soldiers was carrying a pistol. They demanded money and when told that there was none a black soldier hit Louin on the face. When the soldiers ran away they took with them foodstuffs and business papers.

(10) Maria Josephine WATSON, Answay.
14 Grainger Street, Answay. (Identified Pte. Lankovich).
At 20:30 hrs. on the 30th January, 1945, two soldiers entered the above address and started fighting with the owner. One of the soldiers had a pistol, and they took a gold watchband, a handbag containing money and papers.

(11) Pte. 1039, 17 Kamen Street, Answay. (Identified Cpl. Maloney and Pte. Gibson).
About 22:20 hrs. on the 22nd February, 1945, at the Regal Cafe, Kamen Street, two soldiers entered after closing time and demanded some beer. This was refused and one of the soldiers pulled out a pistol, went behind the bar, and took a handbag containing 100 French and personal papers. They also stole seven bottles of wine, and when leaving hit Watt on the face with a pistol and afterwards with a bottle of wine.

On the same date, a quantity of property was displayed, and each witness directed to examine same. The property was divided up into five groups, and numbered (1) to (5), each under representative articles recovered from the following sources:-

- No. (1) Property found in actual possession of Pte. Lankovich when arrested.
- No. (2) Property found in actual possession of Cpl. Maloney when arrested.
- No. (3) Property recovered from No. 17 East Orange, Answay.
- No. (4) Property which Cpl. Maloney and Pte. Gibson attempted to destroy at the Cafe 'Normandie', Schuyler Street, Answay.
- No. (5) Property which was recovered from Louis Van Oyen, Cafe 'Normandie', Schuyler Street, and which was given to him by Pte. Gibson.

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
