given to a large number of those engaged in this work. Many of them have by great self-lenial gone to places of isolation, and are there giving their lives for the welfare of these needy people.

The Self-Sacrifice of the Workers.

Wherever this self-sacrifice and service has been given for the sake of the Master, by placing the co-workers by the side of the
