STRONGER SEX IN ENGLAND GRADU-ALLY BECOMING THE WEAKER.

Recent Census Tables Show 106 Females te Every 100 Males-Seven Women in Every Hundred Doomed to Old Maidship-Causes for the Discrepancy in Numbers-Where Women Lead.

At least seven women out of every hundred are doomed to be old maids, for the sufficient reason that there are not enough hysbands to go

round.

Of the 32,527,843 persons in England and Wales, 16,799,230 are females and 15,728,613 are males, which gives a proportion of 106,9 females to every 100 males.

And the proportion of females is steadily increasing. It has gone up to nearly 3 per cent. in the last forty years.
