HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 3 and 23, which has not been home-steaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other pur-poses, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any mais over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 100 acres, more or less. ENTRY.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken in

situate, or if the homesteader de-sites he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is Situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee suity. entry. of \$10 is charged for a homestead

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted as entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans.--(i) At test six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

each year during the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is decreased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestead, antry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be estimated by such person (0) If a settier has obtained, a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-

Uncate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-scribed by this Act, and has ob-tained entry for a second home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the drat home-stead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first home stead. atesd

stead. (4) If the settler has his per-manent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the seld land.

De satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town-ship or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (8) or (4) must cultivate 80 acres of his bonestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their ac-commodation, and have besides 60 acres substantially fenced. Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Bhould be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Bub-Agent or the Homesteal In-spector. Before making application for patent the settler must give air Commissioner of Dominion Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
