Burgess, is pleasantly situated on the River Mississippi, just in the outskirts of Carleton Junction. Here are kept a herd of about sixty Jerseys of the choicest breeding, which supply the milk, cream and butter for a number of restaurants on the Canada Pacific Railway. The herd is headed by the well-known prize-winning Carlo, whose cut appeared in the Advocate some time ago. Mr. Burgess is also interested in standard-bred trotting horses. He has a number of young things of the Guy Wilkes and Hermit strains, which he expects to see distinguish themselves on the race track. At this point the whistle of the approaching train warned us that we had no time to spare, and we were forced to leave without having had a chance to look through the herd.
