A cable despatch dated Rome, Nov. 20, says: The Vatican has instructed the Papal Nuncio at Rio Janeiro to see that the Brazilian clergy abstain from politics.

The new church in course of erection at Mattawa, district of Nipissing, will be finished this month. Its cost will be about \$45,000.

The widowed Crown Princess of Austria, the Archduchess Stephanie, has made a pilgrimage on foot to the shrine of Our Lady at Maratelli, accompanied by several other members of the Imperial family.

Next spring a \$35,000 church will be built by the Catholics of Boone, Iowa, and a \$75,000 one by those of Oneida, N. Y.

Slater Maria Theresa, superior of the Sisters of Mercy in Tonkin, who recently received the cross of the Legion of Honor, has ministered to the wounded of the French army for thirty years...

The Grand Duchess Catherine of Russia has had a solemn audience from the Holy Father. She was bearer of an autograph letter from the Curia, who expresses a wish that the Archbishop of Warsaw may be appointed to the Cardinalate.

Father Jarrige, of Mysore, India, the oldest missionary in that country, died on September 12. He was born in France in 1796, and went out to India as a missionary in the same year in which the Queen-Empress was born.

The Rev. Francesco Carlucci, an apostle priest of Bari, Italy, has given consolation to the Holy Father by submitting once more to his authority.
