Mr. Bekcher moved, That the Sum of Twenty eight Pounds, Fourteen Shillings and three Pence be paid to the Overfeers of the Poor at Cornevaliis for the Support of two transient Poor Persons, which being feconded and put, passed in the Negative.

The Solicitor General moved, That His Excellency the Governor should be requested to pay out of the contingent Money the Messenger who attends the Council, as well as to provide from the same Fund the necessary Stationary for the public Offices, which being seconded and put, passed in the affirmative.

The House then took into Confideration the several Applications respecting Roads, and

On Motion of Capt. Howe refelved, That the Sum offive Hundred Pounds be granted for the Purpole of compleating the Road lately opened between Annapolis Royal and Shelburne, one Half thereof to be expended on the Road at the Annapolis Side, and the other Half on that part towards Shelburne.

On Motion of Mr. Aplin, resolved, That the Sum of two Hundred Pounds be granted for the Purpose of opening a Road from the Town of Barrington to the Town of Shelburne.

On Motion of Mr. Hill, refolved, That the Sum of One Hundred Pounds be granted for the Purpose of opening a Road from the Settlement of Remsberg to the Road leading from Cumberland to Halifax.

On Motion of Major Millidge, refolved, That the Sum of two Hundred Pounds be granted for the Purpose of opening a Road from the Township of Digby to the River Scissabou.

On Motion of Mr. Archibold resolved, That the Sum of One Hundred Pounds be granted for the Purpose of repairing the Road leading from Outlow to Tatamagushe.

Cn Motion of Mr. Bulkeley Refolved, That the Sum of two Hundred and fifty Pounds be granted for the Purpole of opening a Road from Country Harbour in the County of Sydney towards Pictou by the Way of Manchester and Antigonishe, and that the above Sum be laid out and expended by Commissioners to be appointed by His Excellency the Governor in the County of Sydney.

On Motion of the Solicitor General *refolved*, That the Sum of Fifty Pounds be granted for the Purpofe of compleating the Road leading from the Township of *Falmoutb* to the *Half Way River* fo called.

Mr. Wilkins then moved, That the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds be granted and allowed for the Purpole of creeting a Light House for the safety of the Navigation, leading into the Harbour of Shelburne, to be paid and applied under the Direction of Commissioners to be appointed by the Governor for that Service, which being seconded, and put, passed in the affirmative.

A Petition from Hans Baker, Sheriff of the County of Cumberland (recommended by His Excellency the Governor to the Confideration of the Houfe) praying to be reinsbuiled the Sum of Thirty Pounds, Seventeen Shillings, and ten Pence half Penny, expences incurred by him for apprehending, fecuring, and fub fifting one John Clark a Felon, was read, and difmiffed, The Mr. Belcher motion relative to the ovorfeers of the poor at Cormwallis.
