PRAYERS.

The Honorable the Attorney General, from the Select Committee, to whom was referred the Bill to repeal an Act, intituled "An Act for the more effectual punishment of persons who shall be guilty of the trespasses therein mentioned in the City of Saint John, and to make other and more effectual provision for that purpose," reported that the Committee had carefully examined the said Bill, and recommend that the further consideration of the same should be postponed for three months.

ORDERED, That the report be received.

Whereupon—RESOLVED, That the further consideration of the said Bill be postponed for three months.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the House was put into a Committee of the whole, to take into consideration the Bill in addition to the Laws now in force for establishing a legal tender in all payments to be made in this Province.

The Honorable Mr. Shore took the Chair.

After some time the House resumed.

The Chairman reported that the Committee had gone into consideration of the said Bill had made some progress therein, and asked leave to sit again to-morrow.

ORDERED, That the report be received, and leave granted.

The Honorable Mr. Baillie, by direction of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, lays before the House certain papers relating to a survey of the Bay of Fundy.

Whereupon the same were read by the Clerk, and are as follows:—

SIR,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your Dispatch, No. 5, of the 7th of February, transmitting Addresses from the Legislative Council and from the House of Assembly of New Brunswick, praying that fresh Surveys may be made of the Bay of Fundy. Having directed that application to be referred to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, I have now the honor to enlose to you the copy of a Letter which has been addressed to this Department by their Lordships' Secretary upon the subject.
