DEATH TERMINATES A NOTABLE CAREER
Prof. Goldwin Smith, Passed Away at His Home in Toronto.

TORONTO, June 8.—Goldwin Smith died at 3:20 yesterday afternoon. About 3 o'clock the distinguished scholar was still showing slight signs of life. He had been unconscious for some time. Gathered at his bedside were Dr. Grassett, Goldwin Smith's physician; T. Arnold Haultain, private secretary, and the butler, who may have served in the household at the "Orange" for many years. The end came peacefully, though suddenly, and some time elapsed before the news went out from the death chamber that Toronto had lost her greatest citizen, Goldwin Smith, last mighty survivor in literature of the Victorian era.
 His death was indirectly due to an accident. He slipped on the polished floor of his home in February last. First reports did not alarm the public. It was understood that "while walking" the hall Goldwin Smith had slipped and fallen, was badly shaken up and confined to his bed. An examination by Dr. F. Len Grassett revealed the fact that the right hip bone had been broken, a serious injury to a man of Goldwin Smith's age. Then it was announced that the surgeons attending on Dr. Smith had decided not to try to knit the two portions of the fractured thigh bone.

THE LUMBER CUT
 According to the St. John Standard, Surveyor-General Grimmer is one of the greatest reformers of the age, and has saved the province immense sums of money, which, but for his fearless methods, would have been gathered in by buccaneer lumbermen. The Standard states the quantity of lumber cut on crown lands for a number of years, as given in the government reports. These show a large increase. The Standard contends that there has not really been an increase in the cut, but that Mr. Grimmer has had all of it sealed, and the province enriched by revenue, which formerly went to the lumbermen. It charges that the late government only derived revenue from a fraction of the actual quantity of lumber cut on crown lands. This statement by the Standard is not new. That journal has been making it at intervals ever since it was established. A statement by Mr. Grimmer that the cut on crown lands during the past winter was 280,000,000 feet, compared with 205,000,000 feet in the previous winter, is an excuse for repeating the charges against the old government. The Standard counts much upon the credulity of its readers. Every man who knows anything about the lumber business, knows that the cut on crown lands during the past winter was unusually large. On the Restigouche, for example, the cut is a record for the river. Never before was so large a quantity brought to the stream. There was also an unusually large cut on crown lands on Miramichi and St. John waters. The lumbermen cut more logs, therefore Mr. Grimmer's scales were able to find more loss.—St. John Times.
