John D. Gives A Million To Help Negroes

New York March 10-A person gift of \$1,000,000 by John D. Rockefeller jr. to the Hampton and Tuskegee institutes for negroes was announced last night by Dr. Ansoh Phe'ps Stokes chairman of the spec ialgifts committee of the Hampton Tuskegee Endowment Fund, at 5 Maiden Lane. This brings the sum raised in the campaign to a total of \$3,500,000.
