

LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS

Six inches of snow fell at Westfield, Vt., on the 14th inst.

Twenty women, including a steamer in Bilboa on Friday last, were thrown from the dock and sixteen drowned.

Lady Thompson wife of the Premier broke her arm by an accidental stumble at home. The limb is now set nicely.

It is reported that Charles McDonald, the keeper of the lighthouse at St. Andrew's Point, lost \$125 in the fire at that place Friday.

Tyler broke the two mile standing start bicycle record at Waltham Mass. on Friday last. Time 4:03. Tyler now holds all the standing start records.

Sir John Thompson will leave for England, to be sworn of the Privy Council, about next week from now and is expected to return about the middle of December.

The election in Compton P. Q. for the local seat vacated by H. John McLaughlin, has resulted in the return of Mr. Leary, the Government candidate, by 700 of a majority.

A fire starting in a heap of old waste, destroyed the Intercolonial Railway round house and eight locomotives at Riverside on Monday night. Loss \$200,000.

At Nashville, Tenn., on Saturday Ralph Wilkes was seen against his record of 2:04, and made the mile in 2:04. Hal Dillard went against his record of 2:04, and lowered it to 2:04.

Messrs. Deacon and Drummond, of Prescott, shipped 618 lambs to the United States market on Thursday last. They were forwarded via Somerside and the Northumberland.

The Department of Justice has given instructions to the Hon. J. S. Hall, of Montreal, to take criminal action against Edward St. Louis, contractor, for the Curran bridge over Lachine canal.

Mr. Dillon has presented to his Lordship Bishop McDonald the cheese made at the Winslow Road Factory, which was first prize at the Provincial Exhibition. The gift is highly appreciated.

Mr. W. B. Newsome, formerly of Balaqua, has been elected President of the Toronto Young Conservatives Association, and Mr. W. H. Newsome, well-known in Charlottetown as an elected member of the managing committee of the same organization.

About three weeks ago five Chinamen from Montreal tried to enter the States at Ogdensburg, crossing from Prescott. They were arrested and have been found guilty of unlawfully attempting to enter the States. They will be at once deported to China.

Another severe storm swept the coast of Newfoundland on Thursday night last accompanied by rain and floods. At the height of the storm the schooner "Hunt" broke from her moorings and collided with other vessels in the harbor, damaging her in various ways.

During the lightning and thunder storm on Wednesday last, the house of Captain John McPherson of the steamer "Hillsborough," at Flat River, was struck by lightning. It was not much damaged. It is a strange coincidence that last summer the house situated opposite Capt. McPherson's was struck by lightning.

In the race between Alex and Dinetum at Boston on Saturday, the latter withdrew after the second lap, and Alex won the first two easily. Alex was given a fast third heat in 2:07, the fastest trotting mile ever seen in New England.

The Maritime Province Association was organized in Montreal, on Tuesday evening of last week with the following officers: Mr. William Dawson, honorary president; A. P. Tippet, of St. John, N. B., president; A. G. Rice, New Glasgow, Dr. J. A. Macdonald, of P. E. I., vice-presidents; J. Miller, of McConnell, New Glasgow, secretary; H. J. A. Gildred, St. John, treasurer.

The executive committee are as follows: Nova Scotia—J. R. Green and R. H. Judge; New Brunswick—A. R. Fraser and D. Argovius; Prince Edward Island—D. M. McLeannan and G. A. Roome.

The lighthouse at St. Andrew's Point, opposite Georgetown, was destroyed by fire on Friday morning last. About six o'clock the fire was observed by a number of persons in Georgetown, and a rescue party immediately started in a boat, for the scene of the conflagration, but before they reached the Point the building was almost destroyed.

Moreover they had considerable trouble to effect an entrance, as the door was locked, and the keeper absent. After putting out the light in the morning, as usual, the keeper looked at the door and went to his farm, some distance away. Another family who lives on the Point, close to the lighthouse, happened to be away also. The fire is supposed to have started beneath the living room, from an unknown cause. A large quantity of oil in the lamps was stored in the building, and this taking fire, and a strong wind blowing at the time accounts for the rapidity with which the fire did its work.

Mr. William Moran's recitation was also exceedingly rendered. Readings were given by Senator McDonald, Mr. Thomas Cullen and Mr. James McInnes, which were highly appreciated and heartily applauded.
