"A trench or ditch or most surrounded this Fort; which I have no doubt was similar to the plans of the many old castles still to be seen in England, Ireland and Scotland."

"Over this trench was a draworidge with a small tower at one end." "There were four cannon mounted on this tower. The balls for these cannon weighed four pounds." "Under this tower there was a cellar

for keeping gunpowder." It was undoubtedly a formidable fortress when built, and if well stocked with provisions and ammunition

could put up a strong defence. We can all remember the building where the officers' quarters were situated, in rear where the first Railway Station was erected, also the Ordin ance Street very near where the East End Fire Hall now stands.

The Governor's residence was in the rear of York Street, with a fine garden surrounding it, but there is nothing or very little to trace these old historic spots to-day.

It has been my wish for many years to commemorate these old historic spots with Tablets, giving the facts connected with their early history of St. John's, so that our own people would reverence these localities, and the many tourists that we expect here would recognize, at once, what an important place our city was hundreds of years before those splendid cities of Winnipeg and Chicago were thought of.
